

SPEED MANAGEMENT**ALERT = SAFETY**

- Reduce speed on downgrades to maintain control.
- Reduce speed when approaching ramps and curves.
- As speed increases it takes longer to stop a vehicle.
- Managing speed is a big part of driving safely.

Empty trucks need a greater stopping distance because the vehicle has less traction.

Managing your speed is--adjusting to the conditions around you.

Field of vision includes everything you can see (front and both sides) while looking straight ahead.

When the field of vision is reduced, speed also needs to be reduced.

You should always be able to stop within the distance you can see ahead.



- Speed must be adjusted to existing conditions (Road, traffic, weather, etc.).
- Adjust your speed according to your field of vision.
- Remember fog, rain, snow and ice will affect the field of vision.
- When you overdrive conditions, you are on the verge of losing control of the vehicle.
